All curlers must stay at the designated University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire dorm. Adult counselors will monitor dorm rooms. Curling will take place at the Hobb's Ice Arena. Bus transportation will be provided to all curlers from the dorm to Hobbs. For curlers who drive: car keys must be turned in upon arrival. *Your need for extra money will be minimal, however, you are advised to bring cash or a cash card for spending or in case of emergency.* Do not bring anything of great value (camp officials are not responsible for lost or stolen items).
